The MCESC will provide special education services, including but not limited to physical therapy services, for the 2012-2013 school year. The anticipated cost of this service will be based on the estimated per minute cost of the Consortium for Physical Therapy as established by the MCESC (currently \$1.33 per minute) which will be billed on a monthly basis.

RESOLVED, that the Montgomery County Governing Board of Education enter into a contract with the Dayton Regional STEM School. The MCESC will provide special education services, including but not limited to speech therapy services for the 2012-2013 school year. The anticipated cost of this service will be based on the estimated per hour cost of the Consortium for Speech Therapy as established by the MCESC (currently \$66.83 per hour) which will be billed on a monthly basis.
